## **Family Fun Movies at the Lincoln Theatre Offers Double Features of Family Films for \$1**

Winner of an Oscar for best visual effects, *Babe* tells the story of a pig raised by sheepdogs that learns to herd sheep with a little help from Farmer Hoggett.

Kermit and friends trek across America to pursue the bright lights of Hollywood while eluding a frog-legs restaurant magnate.

***Bee Movie (2007)***

Rated PG

Jerry Seinfeld, Renée Zellweger, Matthew Broderick  
Having recently graduated from bee college, Barry B. Benson makes a special trip outside the hive to a florist in New York City where he discovers humans actually eat honey. He subsequently decides to sue them.

***Alvin and the Chipmunks (2007)***

Rated PG

Jason Lee, David Cross, Cameron Richardson  
Struggling songwriter Dave Seville finally finds success when he comes across a trio of singing chipmunks recently relocated to Los Angeles.

**Saturday July 12**

***Horton Hears a Who! (2008)***

Rated G

Horton the Elephant struggles to protect a microscopic community living on a speck of dust from his neighbors who refuse to believe it exists.

***Charlotte's Web (2006)***

Wilbur the pig fears the end of the season, because he knows he will end up on the dinner table. He hatches a plan with Charlotte, a spider that lives in his pen, to ensure that will never happen.

***Dr. Dolittle (1998)***

Rated PG-13

Eddie Murphy, Peter Boyle, Ossie Davis  
Dr. John Dolittle realizes his childhood ability has returned—he can talk to animals and they can talk to him. Animals flock to him for medical help, but his colleagues are afraid the good doctor has gone mad.

***The Sound of Music (1965)***

This beloved Rodgers and Hammerstein musical swept the Oscars with its breathtaking scenery and unforgettable performances, including “Edelweiss,” “Sixteen Going on Seventeen,” and “My Favorite Things.”

***The Prince of Egypt (1998)***

Rated PG

Val Kilmer, Ralph Fiennes, Michelle Pfeiffer  
Winner of the Best Song Oscar for “When You Believe,” this film tells the story of an Egyptian prince that learns his true Hebrew identity and becomes the chosen deliverer of his people.

***The School of Rock (2003)***

Jack Black, Mike White, Joan Cusack

Down-and-out rock star Dewey Finn finds himself in need of cash, so he poses as a fourth grade substitute teacher at a prep school and ultimately tries to turn his class into a rock band.

**Saturday, August 30**

***Ice Age (2002)***

Rated PG

Denis Leary, John Leguizamo, Ray Romano

Saber-tooth tiger Diego, Sid the sloth, and Manny the woolly mammoth become unlikely heroes when they find a lost human infant and try to return him to his tribe.

***Madagascar (2005)***

Rated PG

Chris Rock, Ben Stiller, David Schwimmer

A lion, zebra, giraffe, and hippo, best friends living at the New York Central Park Zoo, escape their cages only to find themselves hijacked to Madagascar where they learn first-hand about life in the wild.
