The schedule is as follows:

November 21 – Backstage Revue

In celebration of the 10th anniversary of the Lincoln Theatre’s grand reopening, Backstage at the Lincoln will showcase a selection of the talented, local artists that have graced the Lincoln’s stage through this series and other artist incubation programs offered at the Lincoln. Audiences will be seated in the auditorium only for this performance.
